

Carroll Village Council met in regular session on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Tammy Drobina called the meeting to order with pledge to the flag.

Members of Council present were Conda Jones, Linda Dattilo, Deanna Miller, and Martin Rippel. Carole Dreier and Don Deuschle were absent.

Also present was Code Enforcement Officer and Zoning Officer Dennis Rose, Cpl. James Jackson, Village worker Rich Parker, and Clerk Mary Dawson.

Visitors present: none.

Mayor asked for a motion to accept the Minutes for September 11, 2018 regular meeting.

Conda Jones made a motion to accept the minutes as written, 2nd by Deanna Miller. Roll Call vote was all in favor.

Bills for approval were gone over and Martin Rippel had a question on the Fairfield Utility bills. It was discussed and Mayor directed the clerk to find the answer and send to Council tomorrow.

Linda Dattilo made a motion to approve, 2nd by Conda Jones, roll call was all in favor.

No Committee reports.

Police Report for September was reported by Cpl Jackson. Mayor told Council that the Chief applied for a grant for bulletproof vests and was awarded one for almost \$6,000 from the State.

In Zoning, Dennis Rose said there was nothing new this month.

In Code Enforcement there were two properties: 75 Center Street and 0 Market Street, both on vehicles with unlicensed or expired tags.

Solicitor Jeff Feyko reported one new piece of legislation to

set up a fund to receive money deemed forfeited in a drug case. It has emergency language but there are not enough Council members here to vote as an emergency so it will need to go to another meeting. The Mayor said a special meeting will be set to vote on it, as it is her understanding that the funds will be ready to go to the Village imminently.

Mayor Drobina reported that the Storm Sewer Project is now completed. There were some available funds so we were able to install a new sidewalk when the old one was removed during work.

Leaf pick up will start as soon as the leaves come down.

We are having a new fence and gate installed across the driveway to the maintenance dept. because of the continuing issue of dumping there by people from out of town. Village residents who have brush from their property only can call the municipal office to arrange a time to get in, if needed.

Reminder, Trick or Treat is October 31st 5:30 – 7:00 p.m.

Deanna Miller asked if the police could start a little earlier on Oberle Avenue at the edge of town because children are out there prior to 5:30 for Trick or Treat. Cpl. Jackson said he would take care of it.

A Service Committee meeting for the annual review of utility rates was set for Nov. 13 at 6:00pm.
