Old Business

A representative from the Fillin Station, upon request of the Barrel, Bar and Burger, stopped by the office to see if the village would allow them to buy plain plastic cups and place a sticker on them for DORA. The council would like to look to see if any other entity besides Buckeye Lake does this, and check with the solicitor to make sure it doesn't violate DORA regulations. Adam Tippett stated he would like to hear feedback from the third participating business.

New Business

Will Burns met with TC Energy there were several other people involved in the meeting from DLZ. At the intersection of Carnes Rd and Wendy Dr. there will be a manhole and a lift station. TC Energy is adamant about the village not putting anything between their pipes. They stated that they had bought a right-of-way. TC Energy wants an agreement with the village that in the future if TC Energy adds or repairs pipe and damages the village's lift station, TC Energy is not responsible for any damage done to the lift station. Will suggested moving the lift station further south on Carnes Rd. This will move it out of their supposed right-of-way. There will still need to be a manhole placed ahead of the lift station on Wendy Dr. Sample agreements are being drawn up and need to be signed by the mayor.

Kenny George wanted to give a heads up. DLZ Engineering will be taking a valve out across the road. It should be Wednesday or Thursday. The mayor asked if they were going to lose water and be on a boil alert? Kenny said, yes.

The mayor asked who was in charge of the traffic light by Speedway? The fiscal officer answered the village is. The light is out and he needed the name and phone number of the company to call to have it fixed. The fiscal officer will get the information to the mayor.
